Another year of growth and development is behind us and we made several significant strides in 2011. This is particularly remarkable considering that we learned in early June of a refund on state sales tax that would cut

nearly \$1 million out of our operating budget over the next two years. This is in addition to sales tax revenues that have yet to recover due to the lagging economy. The Garfield County Board of Commissioners helped offset this deficit with a grant of \$247,500 and we are extremely grateful for their support


Two of the most significant changes in 2011 include the implementation of the Prospector network for borrowing

materials from libraries statewide. This change has meant shorter wait times for popular titles and better access to academic and specialized libraries for our patrons.



The other big change is that we went mobile with an app for smart phones and tablets. GCPLD 2 Go lets users have quick access to their accounts and our materials.

We continued working on new facilities hiring architects for three projects in Silt, Carbondale and Glenwood Springs which began their design phases in 2011. The New Castle Branch Library began construction in 2011 with a targeted completion in April 2012.

The District's Foundation grew as well with a number of successful grant efforts resulting in an additional \$109,000 for the District in 2011 from sources other than tax dollars. A list of those donors is located below.


